What we mistake for true happiness is nothing more than a temporary high, stemming from the momentary spotlight of attention shining upon us. We just bought that new car and all our friends are oohing and ahing. We feel great about ourselves. We are on top of the world. We are the center of attention. We THINK we are happy. Three or four months from now, maybe six, someone else has bought a

new car, and our spotlight has paled in the shadow of the new king of the mountain. What happened to that feeling we thought was happiness? Did someone take it away from us? Did a thief in the night remove that cloak of glitter to leave us standing naked once again? Or is the truth that we were not truly happy? That feeling we thought was happiness came from something that was tangible, and as it is with all tangible things, they come to us, they are with us for a moment, then in some mysterious way they are gone. We can appropriately say this is one of life’s sorrows. Things are only temporary illusions of what we think happiness is.

Christians have traditionally looked upon the Jews with a certain measure of disdain. They were considered “Christ Killers” by most of Christian Europe. History records terrible persecutions and pogroms at the hands of the Christians culminating with the Nazi extermination program of the recent past. In short, there was very little love lost between Christians and Jews for the past two millennia. As a result of this oppression, the Jews have become extremely resourceful and tight-knit. Instead of the notion that the Jews “dropped the ball” and the Christians “picked it up,” a better concept is that the Jews carefully prepared the way for the Savior and selflessly presented Him to the world at great cost to themselves.

The Christians have been grossly remiss in their appreciation of the magnificent gift they have been given. The Jews may yet get their Messiah at the Second Coming.




AN ALTERNATIVE APPROACH TO HEALTH

Heaven's Health Food Store by Sherilyn Highben


